A MESSAGE FROM OUR LAY PASTOR



How are you getting on with Lent?

Lent is the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. However, if you count the number of days between those dates you will notice that there are in fact 46. That is because Sundays are not part of the period of Lent because every Sunday is a feast day as it is the day Jesus rose from the dead.

Many people give something up for Lent. Others take something up. On the Monday before Ash Wednesday, I was listening to a radio programme and the presenter read out a list of things that people were giving up for Lent. Along with the usual, alcohol, chocolate and crisps, there was one that particularly caught my ear. One person was planning on giving up half a stone for Lent. I don't know who they are but I wish them every success with their diet. Getting through Lenten fasts can be difficult. When I have tried in the past I have often failed. I friend of mine (he used to be the New Testament Greek lecturer at London Bible College where I studied) suggests a way to get through the struggle of Lent. We need to live life in 3D.....

Decision, Discipline and Determination.

DECISION : Luke 9:51 As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem.

DISCIPLINE : Hebrews 12:11 No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace of those who have been trained by it.

DETERMINATION : Galatians 6:9 Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

If you have decided to do something special in Lent I pray that you find the discipline and determination to keep it up.

Discipline and determination are like muscles, the more you use them, the more they grow. Although Lent is a special time of year for fasting, decision making and the discipline and determination to see things through are things we can do all year round. Life in 3D is not just for Lent but for all time.

I am reminded of a memory verse I used to teach kids in a children's club in the London City Mission Hall in Limehouse. It has some words of advice from Mary to the stewards at the wedding in Cana, but also good advice for us today: John 2:5 As the numbers are said, I would put up my left hand first showing two fingers then my right hand showing all five fingers. Then lowering a finger at a time as I spoke each word, starting with the right hand. 'Whatever he says to you', now the left hand, "Do it". What is Jesus telling each of us to do? My prayer is that each of us will respond to Jesus' call on our lives with **DECISION**, **DISCIPLINE** and **DETERMINATION**.

CIRCUIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN

This document has been drawn up as a result of conversations that were shared during one of the exercises at the Circuit Leadership Team Away Day, held on 24th October 2017. The team was given the task of exploring God's mission for the circuit and asked to identify aims for the circuit in the next five years.

In the document we distinguish between objectives, success criteria, and actions to be taken.

An objective is the thing we are trying to achieve. It may also be observable or measurable.

A success criteria is something we hope we see if we are doing the right things, but isn't in itself the reason or purpose behind what we do.

An action to be taken is something we need to do in order to achieve the objective

Some strategic themes emerged from our discussions.

THEMES:

- Doing things together as a circuit that are then delivered locally
- Circuit training for new ways of working
- Using the circuit's resources for a particular church at a particular time rather than spreading them equally
- Building up a sense of circuit

- Building relationships and links between churches

Some development priorities were also identified.

THE CURRENT DEVELOPMENT PRIORITIES:

- *Worship – Each church will have at its heart rich, life-enhancing worship.*
- *Mission – Each church will discern and respond to God’s purpose for mission in the knowledge that being rooted in God makes the difference.*
- *Kingdom – Each church will be welcoming and inclusive, offering fullness of life for all.*
- *Service – Each church will be integrated in the local community, in solidarity with all those who seek the common good.*

The Sutton Circuit aims to be a welcoming, inclusive worshipping community committed to building God’s kingdom through modelling God’s love in acts of service to those around us. The circuit will critique, enable, encourage and develop these priorities through prayer, support, strategic planning and deployment of resources.



Service for Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, Sunday 21st January 2018, arranged by Churches Together in Sutton and Cheam

This uplifting service took place at the beautiful Church of Our Lady of the Rosary, Sutton at which most churches within the CTSC group were represented.

The service was led by Parish Priest, Fr James McGillicuddy who extended a warm welcome to everyone. Members from various churches read the lessons and led prayers with responses from the congregation. Jane Wasbrough read a passage from Exodus ch 15, and this was followed by three

further Bible readings, the last being the story of Jairus' daughter, read by Rev. Mark Williams, Chair of the CTSC group.

Fr James' address emphasised the importance of understanding the needs of others by striving to be accepting of everyone, regardless of their religion, race or colour. He drew our attention to Martin Luther King, the American civil rights activist, and reminded us that this year sees the 50th anniversary since his death.

We heard the story behind the final hymn, Lead Kindly Light, written in 1833 by John Henry Newman, an Anglican priest who later became a Catholic cardinal. The church organ accompanied the hymn singing, which Fr James remarked on as being far heartier than their usual Catholic congregation can muster!

Following the service, we were invited to share in light refreshments in the church hall which gave us an opportunity to meet with those from other churches.

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN SUTTON & CHEAM

The last meeting of CTSC was held at Trinity Church, Sutton on 6th February 2018 and was chaired by Rev Mark Williams. The meeting was well attended by representatives from churches in the area.

Mark Tomlinson brought us up to date with current **Community Works** projects and said that due to a significant increase in the use of the **Food Bank**, more volunteers are needed. The main aim of the **Job Club**, operating since 2014, is helping clients to gain the confidence and skills required to get back into work and this is proving very successful. The latest scheme, **Linking Lives**, began in 2016. Co-ordinator, Leigh Stephens, explained the importance of the role volunteers play in this area and urged others to consider joining the team. The main objective is to befriend elderly and lonely people. This latest project requires a regular commitment, but Leigh emphasised that this could make an enormous difference to someone's life. Mark Williams referred to the **United Service** held at the Church of Our Lady of the Rosary, Sutton on Sunday 21st January 2018 during the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**. It was agreed that Parish Priest, Fr James McGillicuddy, led a very thought provoking service, and it was pleasing that it was well attended.

Colin Howard, local co-ordinator for **Christian Aid Week** in Sutton, told us that CAW 2018 would be held from Sunday 13 to Saturday 19 May. It was regrettable that far fewer churches in Sutton now take part in CAW. Colin said he hoped as many churches as possible would support CAW by organising fund-raising events, taking part in Circle the City, a sponsored walk centred around London churches, (for further information contact the event manager, at ctc@christian-aid.org) or by using and distributing the donation envelopes. Colin also hoped that each church would have a special offering for Christian Aid during CAW.

A **Prayer for Sutton pilgrimage** took place on 13th May 2017. It is not yet known whether this will continue or whether another similar event will be introduced in its place.

The meeting agreed to send our congratulations to Rev Sarah Mullally, previous Chair of this group, who has recently been elected as Bishop of London.
